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#### I- INTRODUCTION

The International Program for the Development of Communication (IPDC) is a program of the United Nations for Education, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) aimed at strengthening media development in developing countries. It is within this framework that the Centre for Communication and Sustainable Development (CECOSDA) received financial support to organise a sub-regional workshop aimed at training thirty (30) community journalists on digital and mobile journalism for service continuity in times of crisis and Covid-19. This workshop brought together three (03) countries of the sub-region, namely Cameroon, Chad and the Central African Republic (CAR).

From 22 to 23 February 2022 in Yaoundé in Cameroon, Bangui in CAR and N'djamena in Chad, thirty (30) community radio journalists, ten in each country, were trained on the use of digital media including the use of Whatsapp Business, video editing and the production of visuals with their smartphones.

The participants were educated on crisis management, in order to develop critical thinking and to avoid disinformation and violence.

#### II- INTERVENTIONS/SPEAKING AT THE WORKSHOP

The representative of the Director of the UNESCO Yaoundé Regional Office, Mr. MOKNI NEJIB - *Head of the Communication and Information Sector* - in his opening remarks urged community journalists to make good use of the video, audio and image production skills they have been given in order to support the IPDC program in the promotion of community E-journalism in the Central African sub-region. The UNESCO Cameroon Project Officer, Mr. HUGUES NDIH, urged the journalists to remain objective and professional in their work.

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Officials from state institutions were also present. The President of the High Council of Communication (HCC) of the CAR Mr. POUAMBI José Richard made a presentation on digital and the law in CAR and encouraged journalists to check the source of information and not to systematically transfer information received online without prior processing. This recommendation was also reinforced by the Director of the Communication, Arts and Culture and Youth and Sport Division - UNESCO CAR who was present at the workshop.

#### III- DEVELOPMENT OF THE ACTIVITIES

The welcome, presentation and installation of participants were done online and in the room (semi-present). The welcome speech was given by the moderator Mrs. NJANZOU Ramatou, which marked the beginning of the activities. The opening speech was given by the Head of the Communication and Information Sector of UNESCO Cameroon, and then the participants and trainers from Chad, CAR and Cameroon introduced themselves.

The training itself took place on the 22nd around four (04) sessions:

- How to use digital technology to continue one's work as a journalist in times of security crisis and COVID-19
- How to use your Smartphone to create an image to raise awareness in your community
- Correction of the practical exercises on the production of audio and video content with Smartphones
- How to animate the Whatsapp business of your community radio
- How to edit a community awareness/information video using your smartphone

The second day of training was devoted to the correction of practical exercises on audio and video content production with smartphones. All participants successfully produced video and image content and shared it on the training group.





#### IV- INNOVATIONS IN TRAINING

#### 1. An efficient technological device

To ensure the success of this inter-country event, CECOSDA set up technological devices to connect the three countries taking part in the workshop without interference.

- A videoconference kit connecting the training rooms of each country
- An online registration link for all participants
- A Whatsapp group for exchange between participants
- Two laptops used for projection and screen sharing via the Zoom application.
- Tie microphones and walkie-talkie microphones used for speaking.
- An internet box with two different operators for optimal connectivity during the workshop
- Video conferencing platform with special hosting

# 2. Institutional strengthening of the community radio networks of each participating country

CECOSDA took the opportunity of this workshop to strengthen the institutional capacities of the **Green Alert Network**, the Chad Community Radio Network and the Media house of CAR by offering to each of them the **Internet KIT**, **4G boxes** purchased in the framework of the workshop organisation.

#### 3. A dynamic Whatsapp group

A Whatsapp group was created and is very dynamic to date, allowing participants from the three countries to continue to share their work and receive corrections from each other. The screenshots below illustrate the interactivity of the participants who are eager to learn new skills and enthusiastic about having taken part in such a workshop.




Figure 2: Presentation and corrections of visuals submitted in




Figure 4: Presentation of visuals on how to use Canva




Figure 5: Using CapCut

#### VI- SUSTAINABILITY OF THE PROJECT

To ensure sustainability of the project, the Whatsapp group of the training was maintained for continuous learning and experience sharing between the community journalists and CECOSDA.

In addition, through this workshop, the **Green Alert Network** which was a network of community journalists in Cameroon became a regional network, increasing from 35 members to 70 members at the end of the workshop.

The internet boxes given to the different journalist networks will enable them to strengthen the digitalisation of their activities.

#### VII- EVALUATION

#### A- A-POST-WORKSHOP EVENTS

Following the training, the journalists produced awareness-raising videos on Covid-19 as a continuation of the learning acquired during the training.

In addition to this, each radio station produced visuals and videos that were posted on the Whatsapp group to advertise their program.

Mr. BOUNGA Giscard appreciated the organisation of this workshop and thanked CECOSDA

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


Figure 6: Thanks from Mr. BOUNGA from Cameroon for this workshop

A certificate of participation was given to each participant present in the room, and by e-mail for those from Chad and the CAR, as illustrated in the captures below.





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


Figure 7: Capture sending certificates by e-mail to participants from Chad and CAR

#### IX- DIFFICULTIES

- Problem of the room (narrow, not allowing for proper distancing).
- The sometimes waddling internet connection caused some problems during the training. Fortunately, the relay trainers present in each country planned by CECOSDA were able to ensure the continuity of the training during the few moments of disruption.
- The level of internet access is not the same in all the countries of the region; this
  difficulty was overcome by purchasing two internet boxes to switch to different
  operators in case of disruptions.
- The creation of the Whatsapp group has enabled the continuity of exchanges during moments of instability of the zoom connection.





- The difficulty of having training facilitators with the same level of competence in the countries. Having noted this, the CECOSDA team organised a training of trainers two days before the event to guarantee the same level of training in the different countries.
- The political context in CAR where a push alert would have created an internet blackout of one hour; fortunately the relay trainers were able to ensure the continuity of the training.

#### PRESS RELEASE

30 community journalists from Cameroon, Chad and the Central African Republic (CAR) trained on the use of digital technology to ensure continuity of their activities in times of security crisis and Covid-19

Yaounde, N'djamena, Bangui. Organised by the Centre for Communication and Sustainable Development (CECOSDA), with the support of UNESCO's International Program for the Development of Communication (IPDC), a sub-regional workshop to strengthen the digital skills of community radio journalists to ensure continuity of their activities in times of security crisis and Covid-19, was held from 22 to 23 February 2022 simultaneously in the three countries, Chad, Cameroon, and CAR. With a strong focus on learning mobile journalism, especially the use of the smartphone for editing videos and images for broadcast on social networks, the semi-presidential workshop brought together 30 community journalists, ten per country, at the Somatel Hotel for participants from Yaounde, at the Maison des Medias du Chad for participants from N'Djamena, and at the SENEVE Surl Room for participants from Bangui. Prior to the workshop, training was organised to ensure that the level of acquisition was the same in each country.

Officials from each country, the representative of UNESCO's regional office for Central Africa in Yaoundé, Mr MOKNI Nejib in Cameroon, the president of the High Council for Communication (HCC), Mr POUAMBI José Richard in CAR, and the UNESCO representative in Yaoundé, Mr NDIH Hugues in Cameroon, took part in the workshop with a presentation on the legal requirements for broadcasting information online using smartphones.

The community radios represented were: for Chad, Radio Mandela FM, Radio Oxygen, Radio Alquoran, Radio Arc en ciel, Radio FM Liberté; for Cameroon, Radio Yemba, Radio Bonakanda, Radio Foutouni, Radio communautaire du Noun, Chronique CRTV, Radio Aurore, Radio Vie et Development; for the CAR, RMCC, Radio Notre Dame, Radio Lengo Songo, Voix de miracles, RAVOCI, Maria, Radio Sewa

CECOSDA took the opportunity of this workshop to strengthen the institutional capacities of the Green Alert Network, the Chad Communication Radio Network and the Maison des Media de RCA by offering each of the institutions internet KITs, 4G boxes, were purchased to ensure the smooth running of the online training. At the end of this training, the new Village Alert Network was created, replacing the old Green Alert Network in the three countries. No doubt the Whatsapp group will continue to be used by the journalists to ensure their exchanges.

With the support of partners such as UNESCO's International Program for the Development of Communication (IPDC), CECOSDA will continue to support the training of community journalists to enable rapid and sustainable community development.
